Barrhaven Food Cupboard Update

We learned recently that the Barrhaven Food Cupboard had to abandon plans to build a new facility on our property, largely due to a lack of government funding. As a result, the BFC Board has committed to an alternative solution --rental of a facility. In discussion with the City, it has been decided that the BFC will renovate and move into 2100 square feet of open space in the Walter Baker Centre. Significant work is needed before this will be possible, so occupancy is unlikely to occur before the first quarter of 2019. At that time, the BFC will move out of the church basement.

We have supported the BFC since its inception, providing rent-free accommodation and many, many volunteer hours. When they move out, some volunteers may continue to help out and we will still have an opportunity to provide the proceeds from Come Sing Noel to the BFC. Council will explore what continuing partnership relationship we might wish to have with the BFC for future consideration.

Bee Bio

Ross will be joining us for our blessing of the animal's service on June 17th. Here is a bit about him.

Ross McEwen was a beekeeper for 37 years. His first experiences with the bees occurred after taking a night course at the University of Guelph, after which he kept a few hives on his rural property near Guelph for two years. Having tested the waters, he then enrolled in the Beekeeping Technician program at Fairview College in Fairview Alberta where he graduated With Distinction. Returning to Ontario Ross and his family settled in the Ottawa Valley as it is one of the most productive honey areas in the province. Establishing The Moonshadow Honey Company, his operation grew to a total of 300 hives. Along the way, he worked as a bee inspector for the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food and also ran a tracheal mite detection laboratory for the Ministry in his facilities. Scaling back his operation in 1990, he began a teaching career with the Renfrew County District School Board. He retired as an elementary school principal in 2009 and continued with beekeeping as a hobby until 2017 when he finally sold off the last of his bees and equipment.
